

An invitation to all members to attend the B-24 Liberator Memorial Australia Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held at our hangar in Werribee on Saturday, 8 November 2025 at 11.00am.

Nominations for membership of the B-24 Liberator Committee of Management for 2026

Nominations for the 2026 committee are as follows.

President

Lyn Gorman

I am standing for re-election as President for 2025-26 as I believe I can continue to provide leadership at a critical time now that Safety Focused Performance Joint Venture (SFP JV) has been contracted to deliver the Hangar 1 project. I have a deep understanding of the B-24 Liberator Memorial Australia, and I am well acquainted with the Australian museums' context and the Aircraft Museums National Network (AMNN), whose conference I am attending in Port Adelaide in October 2025.

We have already had several meetings with SFP JV to discuss matters such as the first stages of their work and the temporary fencing required early in the project. The communication between SFP JV and ourselves is good, as it continues to be with Melbourne Water. I have continued to chair the very useful quarterly meetings of stakeholders in the Hangar 1 project. Attendees come from Melbourne Water, the Department of Transport and Planning, Wyndham City Council and most recently SFP JV. Development Victoria is no longer involved, and the National Trust no longer considers it necessary to send a representative.

With Ron Gretton's help, I have ensured that the right people have been brought together to plan the move of A72-176 from Hangar 2 to Hangar 1 in

the second half of 2027. I continue to lead our Committee of Management and, after each meeting, to inform volunteers of matters of interest at toolbox meetings. I have supported our Vice-President's consistent efforts to tidy up and dispose of unwanted items in and around the hangar and to ensure that OH&S requirements are scrupulously observed by volunteers. I have a very good working relationship with the local State Member of Parliament, John Lister, who is most supportive of our projects.

At this important time for us, I believe I can continue to lead successful negotiations regarding the Hangar 1 project and the grant of additional land to our organisation. I can also prepare the B-24 Liberator Memorial Australia for reaccreditation now that we have been notified by AMaGA that this is scheduled for 2027. I am confident that I will continue to work productively with the project directors of our three aircraft restoration/rebuilding projects.

I believe I can lead the Committee of Management so that its contribution to the organisation is optimal; I shall again organise our annual commemorative service at the Shrine of Remembrance on 23 March 2026; I shall assist in ensuring that new volunteers are well integrated with existing teams; and I will continue to liaise with the company that maintains our website to ensure that content is current and accurate.

I request the support of all members as I nominate for another term as President of the B-24 Liberator Memorial Australia.
